TENATATIVE ITINERARY

<u>Tuesday:</u> Early flight from gateway to Kona, Hawaii. Transfer to Hapuna Beach for a sunset dinner. After sunset, depart for Hawaii Preparatory Academy. Rooms will be assigned and lights out at 11:00 pm.

Wednesday through Saturday: Morning classes, afternoon labs with free time at the beach. Evening activities.

<u>Sunday:</u> An all day tour is planned. We will make several stops along the way to Volcano National Park. After watching a film at the visitor center, we generally walk across the caldera floor. We then continue to the closest viewing area of the most recent volcanic activity before returning to HPA.

Monday & Tuesday: After receiving course completion certificates, we will depart for our flight to Maui. We will transfer to a hotel in beautiful Lahaina. Our time on Maui is set aside for the beach, shopping, and exploring.


MARINE SCIENCE PROGRAM

The course consists of a daily three to four hour class instruction block in some phase of Marine Science. This is generally followed by three to four hours of time at the beach, where lab work is completed. Time for recreation and relaxing is provided after labs. Corals, Fish Families, Mollusks, Arthropods, Echinoderms, Dangerous Marine Animals, Waves & Currents, Plankton, and Food Webs are just a few of the many topics that are covered. Volcano Geology and Hawaiiana are also included. Hawaiian culture study helps students to develop an appreciation of the land and people of Hawaii. There are a few evening and weekend classes. HPA awards each student a certificate with a letter grade upon completion of the course. Grades are based upon class work, notebook, lab write-ups, and a final examination. Attendance is mandatory.

A good set of mask, fins and snorkel, which should be purchased from a dive shop, is needed for this course.

SCUBA CERTIFICATION PROGRAM

SCUBA is offered at an additional charge. Do to time constraints, students may only participate in one program. Equipment needed for the program is provided and loaned to the participants. Students must provide their own mask, fins, and snorkel. In addition, each participant may be required to take a physical examination prior to departure. Forms are available upon request. The program generally consists of morning classes and afternoon in-water instruction provided by certified master divers. Certificates will be awarded upon successful completion of the course.



HAWAII PREPARATORY ACADEMY

Hawaii Preparatory Academy (HPA) is located on 220 acres in the foothills of the Kohala Mountains on the Big Island of Hawaii. During the school year, this Western accredited institution is a boarding school offering two campuses in the town of Waimea. Grades K-8 are located at the Village Campus which houses an average enrollment of 250 students. The Upper School houses grades 9-12 with an average enrollment of 350 students and utilizes three dormitories.

The summer program is generally centered at the upper campus. Academic facilities include 22 classrooms, a lecture hall, music and rehearsal rooms, and science laboratories. Additional facilities include the Gates Performing Arts Center, Davenport Music Center, Gerry Clark Art Center, Technology Center, Davies Chapel, Ko Kakou Student Union, and the Taylor Commons dining room offering exceptional food choices. Athletic facilities include a gymnasium, fitness center, covered littennis courts, and heated swimming pool. During the summer program, many recreational activities are planned for weekends and evening hours.

At an altitude of approximately 2,500 feet the campus commands magnificent views of three mountain peeks. Mauna Loa, Mauna Kea, and Hualalai. This setting enjoys a cool, invigorating climate.

Hapuna Beach, one of the loveliest in the world, is only a fifteen minute drive from the school. This is the site for many labs as well as recreational activities and sunset dinners.
